Waiver of Liability

The undersigned gives permission for the afore-mentioned children (the "Participants") to participate in the Sports Beijing programs for which they are registered. The Participants and the undersigned understand that participation in such activities or events may result in personal injury or other damages to the Participant and such risks are hereby acknowledged.

Medical Authorization

The undersigned authorizes Sports Beijing to provide emergency treatment for any injury to, or illness of, the Participant(s) if medical personnel consider treatment necessary and perform the treatment. This authorization is granted only if the undersigned or other given contacts could not be reached after reasonable effort was made to do so.

Release

Sports Beijing, the Participant and the undersigned parent or guardian understand and agree that Sports Beijing, its employees, officers, directors, agents, sponsors, volunteers or representatives will not be liable to the Participant, the undersigned, his/her heirs, executors, administrators and assigns for any manner of actions, causes of action, claims, demands, personal injury or injuries, damages, destruction, theft to or of his/her property or otherwise, whatsoever or howsoever arising, whether through negligence or otherwise, resulting from, or occurring in connection with, activities or events organized by Sports Beijing.

Indemnification

The undersigned parent or guardian further agrees to completely indemnify Sports Beijing for any expenses or liabilities incurred as a result of any injury or other loss to the Participant including, without restricting the generality of the foregoing, the costs of emergency services.

Code of Ethics

Player's Code of Behavior

- play by the rules. Never argue with an official. If you disagree, have your captain, coach or manager approach the official during a break or after the competition.
- Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials and sledging other players, deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent are not acceptable or permitted behaviors in any sport.
- Work equally hard for yourself and/or your team. Your team's performance will benefit, so will you.
- Be a good sport. Applaud all good plays whether your team or the opposition makes them.
- Treat all participants in your sport as you like to be treated. Do not bully or take unfair advantage of another competitor.
- Cooperate with your coach, teammates and opponents. Without them there would be no competition.
- Participate for your own enjoyment and benefit, not just to please parents or coaches.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

Parent's Code of Behavior

- Remember that children participate in sport for their enjoyment, not yours. Encourage children to participate, do not force them.
- Focus on the child's efforts and performance rather than winning or losing.
- Encourage children always to play according to the rules and to settle disagreements without resorting to hostility or violence.
- Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a competition.
- Remember that children learn best by example. Appreciate good performances and skilful plays by all participants.
- Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities.
- Respect officials' decisions and teach children to do likewise.
- Show appreciation for volunteer coaches, officials and administrators. Without them, your child could not participate.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

Coach's Code of Behavior

- Remember that young people participate for pleasure and winning is only part of the fun. Never ridicule or yell at a young player for making a mistake or not coming first.
- Be reasonable in your demands on players' time, energy and enthusiasm.
- Operate within the rules and spirit of your sport and teach your players to do the same.
- Ensure that the time players spend with you is a positive experience. All young people are deserving of equal attention and chances.
- Avoid overplaying the talented players; the just average need and deserve equal time.
- Ensure that equipment and facilities meet safety standard and are appropriate to the age and ability of all the players.
- Display control, respect and professionalism to all involved with the sport. Encourage your players to do the same.
- Show concern and caution toward sick and injured players. Follow the advice of a physician when determining whether an injured player is ready to recommence training or competition.
- Obtain appropriate qualifications and keep up to date with the latest coaching practices and the principles of growth and development of young people.
- Any physical contact with a young person should be appropriate to the situation and necessary for the player's skill development.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

Infectious Diseases Policy

It is strongly recommended that all contact sports coaches, managers, officials, players and their parents be informed of this policy and adopt its common sense recommendations. A number of blood-borne infections diseases can be transmitted during body contact sports. The more serious include HEPATITIS and HIV (AIDS) infections. These diseases may be spread by contact between broken skin or mucous membranes and infected Blood – Saliva (not HIV), Semen, and vaginal fluids. N.B. There is no evidence that sweat, urine or tears will transmit Hepatitis B or HIV. The FOLLOWING RECOMMENDATIONS WILL REDUCE THE RISK OF TRANSMITTING INFECTIOUS DISEASES. (All open cuts and abrasions must be reported and treated immediately.)

1. It is every participants responsibility to maintain strict personal hygiene as this is the best method of controlling the spread of these diseases.
2. The practices of spitting and urination in team areas must not be permitted.
3. All participants with prior evidence of these diseases are strongly advised to obtain confidential advice and clearance from a doctor prior to participation.
4. Sharing of towels, face washers and drink containers should not occur.
5. It is strongly recommended that all staff working in contact sport team areas should be vaccinated against HEPATITIS B.
6. In all training areas, open cuts and abrasions must be reported to the coach and treated immediately.
7. If bleeding cannot be controlled or a wound securely covered, the player must not continue playing.
8. Although Hepatitis B vaccination is usually effective in raising immunity to Hepatitis B, it provides no protection against other blood-borne diseases such as HIV. Vaccinations must not result in any relaxation of hygiene standard.
